6. Bible stories about the Apostle Paul – and how he left a legacy as a missionary for Christ.

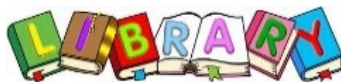
Students learned a lot this week and we will continue our educational journey into this final week before Thanksgiving Break.
